RIDDLE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL  
RESTRUCTURES ORGANIZATION

Riddle Memorial Hospital, in the past, was a non-profit hospital. As such, exempt from taxes. However, it was also restricted to activities which were compatible with the not-for-profit status.

In order to gain more flexibility, and allow the organization to produce additional income, RMH has re-organized its structure. The re-organization was effective July 1st, 1985.

When re-organization took place, the controlling body of the new "Riddle System" will be the "Riddle Memorial Foundation". The Foundation will be administered by its own Board Of Directors.

The Foundation will oversee the operation of five major corporations. Each corporation will have a Board Of Directors and a Staff of Officers, President, Vice President, etc.

The major components of the restructured Riddle System is as follows: -

RIDDLE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION - The Foundation will be the development arm of the System. Fund Raising, including the efforts of our Auxiliaries, will come under the umbrella of the Foundation. It will also coordinate the functions of the five subsidiary corporations.

#1 - RIDDLE PHYSICIAN SERVICES - This corporation will be responsible for contracting with hospital based physicians, such as anesthesiologists, pathologists, radiologists, etc. for the purpose of providing such service for the hospital

#2 - RIDDLE HEALTH CARE SERVICES - This corporation will provide designated out-patient health care for such enterprises as the Alcohol Rehabilitation Center now under construction.

#3 - RIDDLE SYSTEM SERVICES - This corporation will provide certain management and support services to other entities within the Riddle System.

#4 - RIDDLE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL - This corporation will continue to provide all of the health care services traditionally provided by the hospital.

#5 - RIDDLE ENTERPRISES, INC. - This corporation will engage in for-profit ventures. For example, it will coordinate the activities of
