


RIDDLE MEMORIAL HOSPITAL ACQUIRES
COMPUTERIZED ANESTHESIA DELIVERY SYSTEM

We are the first hospital in the country completely equipped with the new Narkomed III, a computerized anesthesia delivery system.

Developed in Germany, and manufactured in Telford, Pennsylvania by the American Draeger Company, this equipment features safety factors not previously available.

The computer enables the anesthesiologist to simultaneously monitor the patient's blood pressure, temperature, ventilator pressure, breathing pattern, percent of oxygen delivered, amount of oxygen in the blood, and the amount of carbon dioxide that the patient exhales per breath.

The carbon dioxide monitoring feature was invented by Heinz Oehmig, M.D. of Phillips University, Warburg, Germany.

Dr. Oehmig conducted an extensive training program in our hospital to familiarize the hospital's Department of Anesthesiology with this sophisticated equipment.

Acquisition of this state-of-the-art equipment was made possible through the donation of all our Associated Auxiliaries of RMF. Thank you one and all for your tireless efforts and enthusiasm.

A Thanksgiving Molded Cranberry Relish/Salad

Sallie McPhillimy's favorite)

YIELD: ONE MOLD
PREPARING: 30 MINUTES
CHILLING: 3 HOURS

- 1 Regular size raspberry Jello
- 1/2 lb. fresh ground cranberries
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 cup hot water

- 1 cup chopped celery
- 1 small can crushed pineapple drained
- 1/2 cup chopped nuts
- 3/4 cups red seeded grapes

Add hot water to Jello, mix and set aside to cool. In the meantime, combine the rest of the ingredients, then add to the Jello and put into mold. Refrigerate until ready to serve.
