


ASSOCIATED AUXILIARIES OF RIDDLE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION INSTALLS OFFICERS 1993 - 1994



The Annual Meeting and Installation of Officers of the Associated Auxiliaries of Riddle Memorial Foundation was held at the Springhaven Club, on Wednesday, July 2nd, 1993.

President, Toni Cavanagh, introduced Mr. Donald L. Laughlin, President of Riddle Memorial Hospital. Mr. Laughlin thanked everyone for inviting him. He stated that the state of the Hospital is financially solvent. The South Pavilion is on time and on budget. It will be a significant asset to the Hospital and to the community. Riddle Village is on time and 80% has been sold. Mr. Laughlin also spoke of the many changes that will happen with the new programs that will come out of Washington, but declared that Riddle will be a survivor, and that all monies and efforts will be well spent. He thanked all the Auxiliaries for their 35 years of help. A special "thank you" was given to Toni Cavanagh, and she was presented with a gift from Administration, Medical Staff and Board of Directors.

President, Toni Cavanagh, presented a check in the amount of \$300,000.00, making a total of \$600,000.00 given by the Associated Auxiliaries to the Hospital toward their million dollar pledge.

President Toni then spoke of her 34 months

of working for the Associated Auxiliaries. She thanked all those who helped her and expressed the wish that we would all work together as a family for the good of the Hospital. She then turned the meeting over to Letty Clark, who is a Past President, and who installed the officers.

1991. Parking Garage 1992, Outpatient Pavilion 1994. The Pavilion has been planned since 1988. It will house a new entrance for Outpatient Services, improved patient traffic flow, more and more parking, greater patient privacy, shorter waiting time, more space in waiting area, expanded and up-dated Outpatient service and equipment, such as new Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory and a new bridge to the main Hospital building. The services in the new Pavilion are Physical Therapy and Rehabilitation Center, Sports Medicine, and Work Rehabilitation Center, Women's Imaging, and Diagnostic Center, and Outpatient Surgery. To help make this Outpatient Pavilion a reality, the Associated Auxiliaries is part of the winning combination by pledging one million dollars.

The weather was perfect!




The evening will begin with a wine and cheese party and Art Show, followed by an Art Auction. Great fun and surprises!
