October 2nd, 1992 was the ground-breaking ceremony for the new Outpatient Pavilion. Highlights of the Ceremony included remarks from Toni Cavanagh, President of the Associated Auxiliaries, Dr. McCurdy, John S. J. Brooks, Esq, Kathy Warren, RN, and the Honorable Matthew J. Ryan.

President Donald L. Laughlin and Dr. Francis Cianciulli unveiled a scale model of what the Hospital campus will look like when construction is completed.

The 25 million dollar project includes space for Outpatient, Surgical, Rehabilitation Services, and physicians offices. The Pavilion is expected to be ready for occupancy by the Summer of 1994.

The ground-breaking ceremony was also the kick-off of a 4 million dollar campaign. The Associated Auxiliaries started things off with a check for \$300,000.00 as the first installment of our pledge of one million dollars towards the campaign.

Members of Riddle's Parking Committee and representatives from the Granite Run Mall cut the ceremonial ribbon for the opening of the Parking Garage




The Ribbon Cutting Ceremonies were held on October 25th, 1992 for the opening of a 700 space garage.




